Description

The Steiner 4 wheel drive tractors can be quickly turned into an aerator with this rugged 40 inch wide attachment. Ground driven shaft with greasable bearings has eighteen, 5 inch fixed tapered tines. Down pressure of the front lift uses the weight of the tractor to penetrate turf. The aerator has a weight box to carry additional weight if extra penetration is required.

SIGNAL WORD DEFINITIONS

GENERAL SAFETY

- 1. Read and understand the owner's manual, before attempting to operate this machine.
- 2. Operate all controls from the operator's seat. NO RIDERS.
- 3. Keep all shields in place and safety switches adjusted properly.
- 4. Do not leave equipment unattended. STOP the engine and remove the key.
- 5. Do not allow minors or the inexperienced to operate this machine.
- 6. Keep people and pets a safe distance away from machine using power driven attachments. Injury could result from flying debris.

OPERATING SAFETY

- 1. Do not attempt to work on unit or any attachment with the engine running. STOP ENGINE!
 - 2. Before leaving the tractor seat:

Set PARKING brake and STOP engine



CAUTION

Be Alert for irrigation lines, sprinkler systems, stones, curbs, or any objects in the path of the aerator.



CAUTION

Use caution when operating on slopes. The steering ability is reduced when down pressure is applied to the implement.

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS FOR AERATOR

- 1. Attach to 4--wheel drive Steiner tractor only. This aerator will not work with any other style tractor.
- 2. Attach to front lift in the usual manner.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

To operate aerator:

- 1. Apply down pressure sufficiently to raise the front wheels of the tractor off the ground. This applies the weight of the tractor to the aerator and enables you to steer.
- 2. Adjust ground speed according to conditions.
- 3. In dry hard turf conditions it may be necessary to irrigate before aerating. Also weight may be added in the aerator weight box. **CAUTION!** When weight is added to the aerator, a rear weight bar is required. Add rear weights equal to but not more than the weight added to the aerator.




